- Design and develop communication tools, program materials and outreach materials for Seniors' Programs
- Outreach to recruit newcomer seniors
- Support in planning and organizing NCT Seniors' Cooking sessions
- Support the documentation and report writing
- Support to Snow Removal Program as required
- Collect and collate statistics/data for evaluations, case studies and success stories
