# A coordinated response to COVID-19: The Vaccine Engagement Project

In the city-wide effort of boosting the vaccine rate of priority neighborhoods, the East York and Don Valley (EYDV) consortium was exemplary of such massive and efficient collaborations. Access Alliance was privileged to lead the EYDV Vaccine Engagement Project from April 2021 - March 2023. We are extremely thankful to the partner organizations for their genuine collaboration and contribution to saving people's lives and building a safer community through the successful implementation of the project.

Taylor Massey-Oakridge-Victoria Village was one of the least vaccinated neighbourhoods during the summer/fall of 2021. With a coordinated effort between the partners, we raised the vaccination rate above the City's average and significantly reduced the COVID-19 hospitalization rates during the pandemic peak.

The pandemic brought unforeseen circumstances and many challenges, especially to marginalized and equity-seeking populations in accessing COVID-19 vaccines and other community services. We commend our community health ambassadors (CHAs) who, throughout the pandemic, played a valiant role in facilitating a wider range of community engagement initiatives to address those barriers.

The CHA model provided skill-building and growth opportunities to the ambassadors, which in turn contributes to building a stronger community. The successes of the CHA model can be replicated as an effective community engagement strategy. In addition, the partnership structure has proven a successful model, which we can build on to address other emerging community issues in the future. We sincerely thank the City of Toronto for the project's funding and overall coordination support.

# Increased Vaccine Confidence, Access & Equity



The **RioMix service** provided residents with translated documents, including:

- COVID-19 infection/transmission information
- COVID-19 vaccine information
- At-home PCR and Rapid-Antigen Test information,
- Mobile vaccination clinic information

With the help of our Ambassadors—who speak a variety of languages including Urdu, Hindi, Gujarati, Tamil, Telugu, Patois, Spanish, Albanian, and Bengali—unofficial translation/interpretation was provided for clients and community members visiting hyperlocal/mass mobile vaccination clinic sites.

We offered residents **transportation supports**, including Presto cards (loaded with 2 adult fares) and Uber vouchers (\$15, \$25, \$50) for rides. These helped to get residents to and from COVID-19 vaccination clinics. These supports were used throughout the pandemic while COVID-19 vaccination clinics were located across the city.

Ambassadors supported community members with **vaccine booking assistance**, booking appointments over the phone and in-person both door-to-door, and in community spaces. Ambassadors also assisted community members without health cards to access their vaccine certificates.

The success of our pandemic response program and vaccine engagement project is a testament to the power of effective partnership, including the invaluable contributions of our community health ambassadors. . . their dedication and hard work have been instrumental in improving public health outcomes for all.

#### **Hyper-Local Clinics**

These barrier-free and accessible clinics were made available to residents of Taylor Massey, Oakridge and Victoria Village.

When the vaccine was newly available, vaccination clinics were sparse and scattered across the city. Hyper-local clinics were essential for improved access to vaccinations. Held in residential buildings, community centres, schools, and food banks, these clinics ensured that vaccines were accessible to residents with mobility issues, language barriers, and those unable to take time off work to travel far for a clinic.





#### **PPE Distribution**

Residents were provided with Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as masks, sanitizer, Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) kits, PPE kits (with masks and sanitizer) to support with community health and wellbeing, and reduce the spread of COVID-19.

As the Community Ambassador Lead for TNO, I was privileged to be part of the EYDV Vaccine Engagement Team . . . [We] established trusting relationships with many residents from diverse backgrounds. We collaborated with ambassadors from different organizations . . . to connect people to essential resources . . . [addressing] critical health and social service needs in our community. Through this work, we met new people, enhanced our skills, and positively impacted the lives of those around us.

# Non-Insured Vaccine Booking

In order to support equitable access to vaccines for people without Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) cards, the City partnered with Access Alliance and the FCJ Refugee Centre to create temporary health numbers for people without OHIP to get their vaccines. Our team reached out to uninsured residents and vaccinated 4521 individuals.




# GO-VAXX Mobile Vaccine Clinics

To provide easy-to access vaccinations in areas with low vaccination rates, we partnered with Metrolinx and the province to host GO-VAXX Bus Clinics in both the east and west ends of the city. Eligible residents were able to receive their 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th COVID-19 vaccine onboard a GO-VAXX Bus.

This project allowed us to create opportunities that were not available, build communities and enhance safety around health resources. It is commendable how CHAs went above and beyond to achieve these outcomes.
